HYSA Prepares for 40th Anniversary Celebration

2004-2005 will be a season full of celebration, new works, reunions and exceptional music. HYSA turns 40 in

December, and Artistic Director Henry Miyamura has themed this landmark season, **Past, Present and Future**. Henry is preparing programs that will not only highlight the outstanding talents of our orchestras, but will also include performances by Youth Symphony alumni from around the globe.

Although its roots reach as far back as the mid-1950s, HYSA was officially incorporated in December 1964. What began as a small orchestra has grown to seven orchestras educating 600 children between the ages of 7-18 who represent 85 public, private and home schools throughout the state. HYSA has a proud history and has achieved a great deal over 40 years.

An additional high note of this season is that it marks the **20th year** that Maestro **Henry Miyamura** has lent his artistic genius to HYSA's programs. Henry has influenced the lives of countless students during his career and we applaud—and gratefully acknowledge—him for his lifelong commitment to building better lives for our young people.



We also welcome **Selena Ching**, HYSA's new Executive Director, who

started in mid-August. Selena is a wonderful addition to our HYSA family. Her background in development and working with nonprofits will help steer HYSA through its next decade of challenges and accomplishments.

As we plan for our 40th anniversary season, I want to extend a warm mahalo to our students, their families, our board, and especially our dedicated music and administrative staff for creating an environment of continual, positive learning



for our young musicians. And I want to express our sincere gratitude to the fun-

November 20



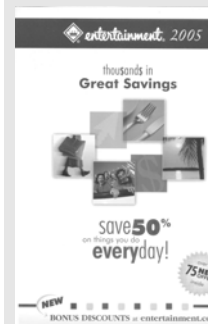

First Hawaiian Foundation Funds Winter Concert

HYSA received a generous \$10,000 grant from the **First Hawaiian Foundation** in support of the 2004 Winter Concert, scheduled for December 5 at the Neal Blaisdell Concert Hall. Entitled ***Fanfares: Celebrating 40 Years***, this concert will feature Youth Symphony I, Youth Symphony II and Concert Orchestra, and will kick off HYSA's 40th anniversary season. Artistic Director Henry Miyamura has invited two very special alumni as guest artists for this performance.

String bassist **Kurt Muroki** played with the Youth Symphony in the mid-80s and currently resides in

New York City working as a freelance musician and a chamber music artist. A graduate of the Juilliard School, Kurt has played on concert stages throughout the world, and is the bassist in several New York ensembles and orchestras.

Fellow HYSA alum **Anna Lim** will be another featured guest at the Winter Concert. A Professor of Violin at Princeton University, Anna has been a member of several award-winning groups and recorded on many American labels. Anna played her first concert with the Honolulu Symphony at the age of 5.

Mr. Miyamura will be commissioning new fanfares to be premiered at this landmark concert.

Pacific Music Institute a World-Class Success

For one week this past July, 128 students from each of the major Hawaiian islands, Tokyo, Texas and California gathered in Honolulu to participate in a musical immersion program. Registered students auditioned for seats in Concert Band, String Orchestra, Jazz Band and various chamber ensembles. A group of nineteen faculty members comprised of some of the state's most prominent music educators facilitated the intensive workshops. The daily regimens culminated in a free-to-the-public finale concert.

This annual summer program is open to students in grades 8

through 12. PMI offers participants opportunities to strengthen their musical skills and enhance their understanding of diversity as students come from varied ethnic, cultural and economic backgrounds.



HYSA is grateful for a \$5,000 grant from the **JACKIE CHAN CHARITABLE FOUNDATION** which provided scholarships for 16 students to attend PMI. The generosity of world-

renowned actor and philanthropist, Jackie Chan, enabled students to share in a memorable week of music, fellowship and outstanding performances. ♪
